

**Snyder Township Board of Supervisors
Regular Monthly Meeting
March 31, 2022**

The monthly meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Holt in the Snyder Township Building, 15706 Route 28, Brockway, Pennsylvania at 7:00 PM. Chairman Holt welcomed everyone and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Supervisors present were Michael Holt, Ronald Freemer and Thomas Sedlock. Township Officials present were Secretary-Treasurer Mary Fremer, Roadmaster Joe Puhala, Auditor Jake Rindosh, Fire Chief Mike Hoskavich and EMA Director Terry Fustine. Correspondence included a notification from Century Engineering of preparation of a renewal permit for the Sewage Association.

Chairman Holt touched on letters from GD&F for permit applications being submitted for the RT 219 Drainage Improvement Project.

Tom Sedlock asked the board to adhere to the fact all meeting business ends at the end of each meeting as he confirmed with PSATS.

The minutes from the February meeting were approved as read.

The Treasurer's Report was read with balances as of March 31, 2022. ARPA Fund balance \$15,713.07; General Funds balance \$279,072.82; Liquid Fuels Fund balance \$228,601.96. Ron Freemer motioned to accept the Treasurer's Report with Tom Sedlock second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried.

Township Reports

EMA Coordinator Terry Fustine reported on the activities for the EMA for the month of March. Michael Holt motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-3 updating the EMA 2022 Plan along with the Promulgation with Ron Freemer second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried.

The Fire Chief reported on the activities for the fire department for the month of March. There are now six new members, trainings are scheduled and fund raisers continuing.

The Roadmaster reported on the road work and equipment maintenance for the month of March.

Michael Holt motioned to hire Jeff Knapp as code officer with Tom Sedlock second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried.

Michael Holt motioned to hire Terry Bailey as full time to the road crew with Ron Freemer second. Michael Holt and Ron Freemer voted yes; Tom Sedlock voted no and the motion carried.

Michael Holt stated it is still being researched as to an ordinance to cover fires or destruction to township places with no insurance to assure the destruction clean up.

Michael Holt motioned to accept the low COG bids for the #8 and 2A limestone from Woodland Equipment & Supply Company and the low bid for the CRS2 and MC70 from Jefferson Paving Corp with Tom Sedlock second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried.

Michael Holt motioned to accept the resignation of Randy Foringer, lawn care, with Tom Sedlock second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried. Joe Puhala will approach several people to submit their prices for mowing here at the township building,

Michael Holt motioned to table the request from the Sewage Association for ARPA fund donation with Ron Freemer second. All supervisors voted yes and the motion carried.
